

ProQuest Ebook Central at EuNC

What is ProQuest Ebook Central?

ProQuest Ebook Central is an eBook repository that EuNC is using, along with OverDrive, for delivering eBook titles to our students, faculty and staff. We have added as an option at EuNC in order to have additional titles available that we could not currently purchase in our OverDrive collection. In order to find out what books are available, it is advised to start with Koha for your search (<https://koha.eunc.edu>). In Koha, you can search for the titles you are looking for and it will show you which areas you can access them including print/physical copies, online resources, OverDrive copies and ProQuest copies. Then, you can determine the best way to get the book for you.

How do I get there and how to I get an account?

Login to Moodle and in the Quick Links area you will see an option for “ProQuest”. Click on that icon/link text. This will take you to the ProQuest login screen. If you don’t see the screen below, click on the Sign In link in the upper right hand corner and it will bring you to this page.

If you have already created an account before, go ahead and login. If not, click on the Request Account page. This will take you to a form to fill in to create your account. NOTE: This account is distinct to this system and not linked to your Moodle account for username and password.

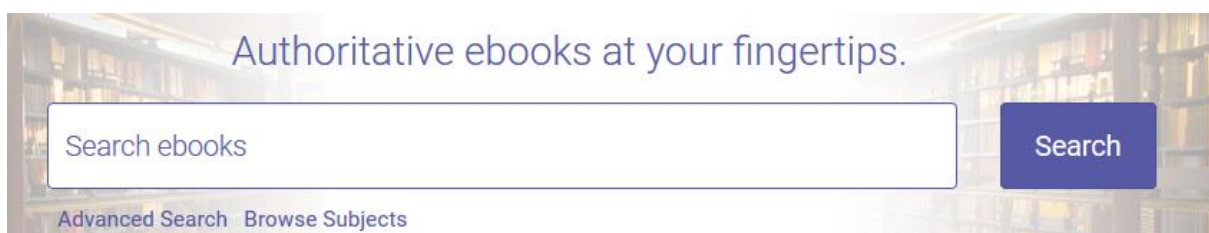

NOTE: in order to get to the Request Account link you must go through Moodle to get to ProQuest. However, once your account is created, you can go directly to <https://proquest.eunc.edu> and login.


Reading a book online

After logging into the system, you will have a screen with a searchbox and additional help information. You can search for a specific title in the main search box or you can browse subjects and see books that way.



At the bottom of the screen is a way to browse through the full collection in the “featured titles” list or if you hit the search button without any text in the search field, it will bring up all of the titles that EuNC owns.

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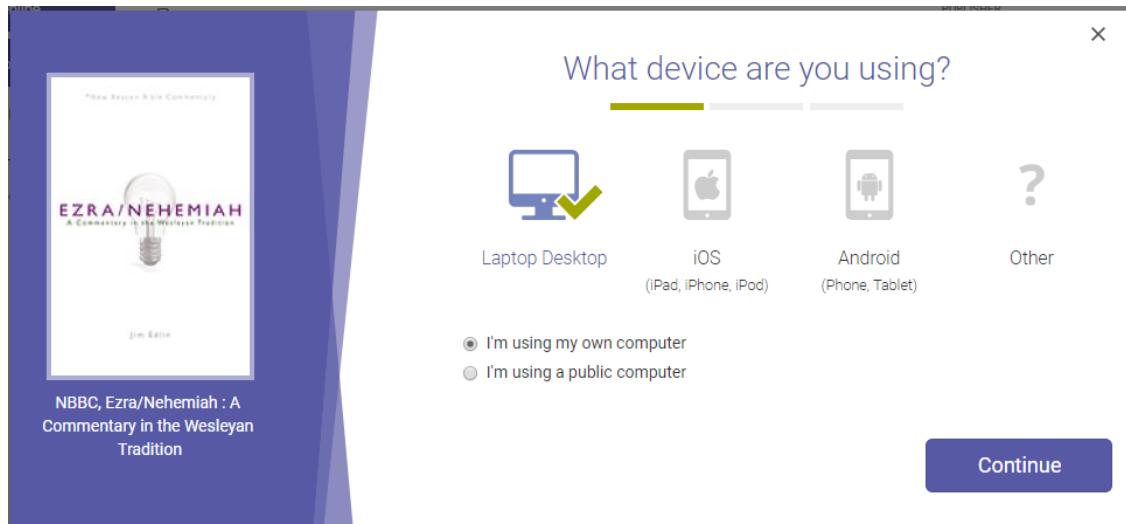
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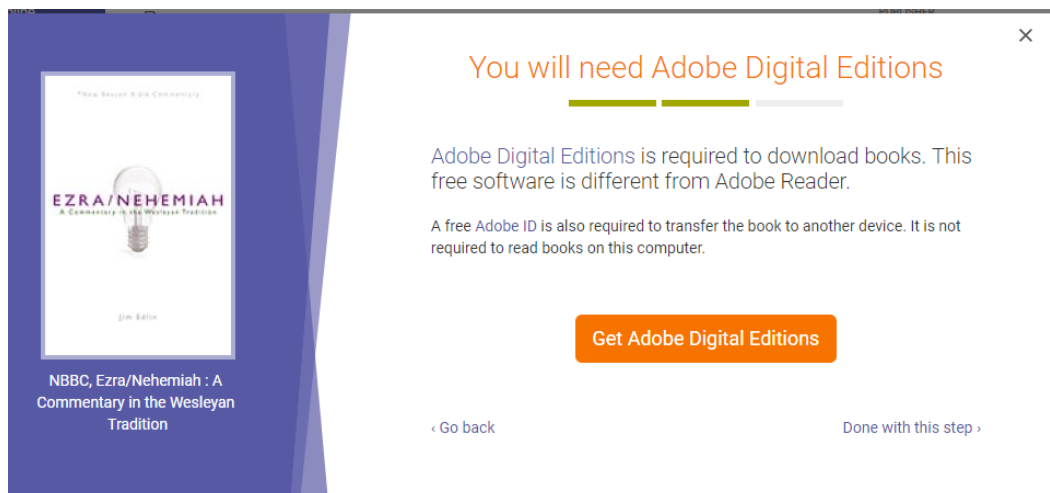
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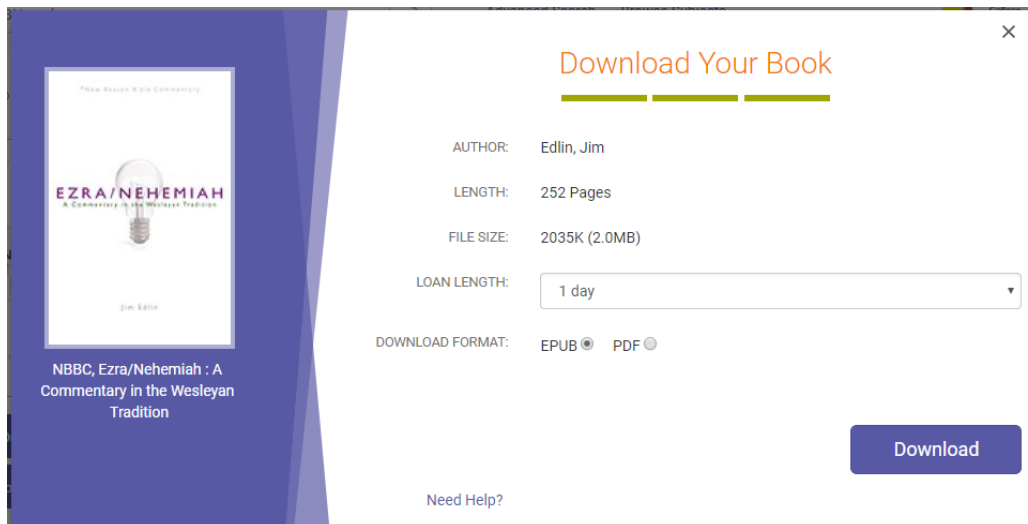
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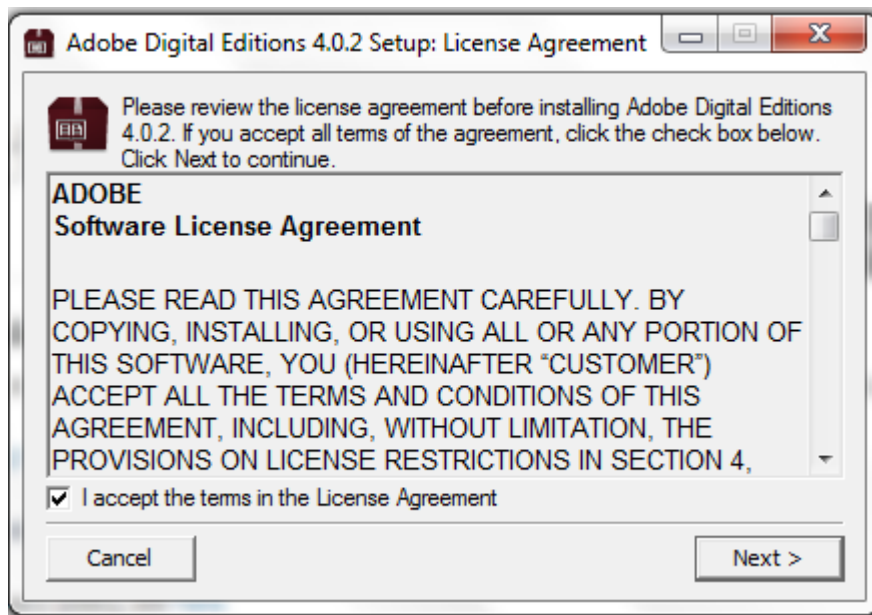
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- For Android/IOS: the procedure is similar to above. It should open up Bluefire Reader automatically and then you can read it or see it in the Bluefire library list. However, the interactions between browsers and Bluefire Reader vary. For my device, Chrome didn't open up Bluefire and complete the download, however Firefox did. So, if you have a problem with one browser, try a different one and see if that works better for you. There is no specific app for ProQuest like OverDrive has.
